The Orchard Centre has a range of classroom spaces and outdoor areas focusing on building a stimulating and welcoming environment whilst paying particular attention to the learning and sensory needs of each young person.

Our 'Rising Stars' provision is available at key stage 2 and 3 for those young people in need of a more nurturing intervention. This effectively replaces missing or distorted early nurturing experiences by immersing young people in an accepting and warm environment which helps develop positive relationships with both teachers and peers.

Rebuilding education for our young people

We offer a fully supportive and bespoke programme of integration which is conducted by a specialist Teaching Assistant. As part of a thorough induction programme young people are initially assessed to explore academic levels and areas of need, in order to identify any additional support required and subsequently ensure bespoke interventions are in place.

We strive to offer a range of academic and technical qualifications, which include GCSEs. In key stage 3 all young people have access to a full national curriculum offer with the exception of modern foreign languages. Music sessions are offered as part of an enrichment offer as an extracurricular activity. Young people undertake their learning through a 'Project Based Learning' model, giving them access to a wide variety of challenges, academic support and exploratory learning.

		Young people also have the opportunity to access non-GCSE accreditation where appropriate. We also offer an extended 'outdoor learning' programme onsite which develops into the Duke of Edinburgh award for those who are keen to explore this further. In key stage 4 young people have the opportunity to study a variety GCSE subjects alongside some technical subjects. We aim to give our young people access to a broad range of enrichment and employment-based courses to complement their academic study to prepare them for further education or employment. Special exam arrangements such as a reader, amanuensis and/or extra time are in place for identified young people. In some cases, where appropriate, young people will attend some lessons in their mainstream school setting.

The service works with young people from both Key Stage 1 – 4 that are referred from mainstream schools and medical and psychological practitioners for post-operative recovery, life limiting conditions, anxiety, depression, self-harm, severe health needs, eating disorders and those who have experienced significant trauma. We provide access to appropriate education for all young people with medical needs. We work in close partnership with parents/carers, medical and educational professionals, outside agencies and stakeholders, to minimise interruption and disruption to the education of young people. Our focus is on the individual young person and rebuilding their education and our aim is to reintegrate young people back to school as soon as possible and track young people on discharge in order to ensure successful outcomes. **Hospital School Room** At New Cross Hospital, every young person from Reception to Year 11 is welcome in the School Room. If they are unable to access the School Room, they may be taught at the bedside. The School Room is open during term time. Long-stay patients, recurrent patients or those studying for/sitting exams are prioritized. We provide a secure, vibrant and welcoming environment in a fit for purpose classroom. Our core values are based around Support, Trust, Achieve and Respect. Our curriculum is designed to give all of our young people a balanced education through experience, opportunity and progression to allow us to maximise achievement and personal

development in context of young people's medical needs.

Alongside academic success, we promote and encourage a nurturing side to learning that focuses on well-being and engagement. This has a strong emphasis on meeting young person's social, emotional and mental health alongside medical needs in order to promote high quality outcomes and raise aspirations for all young people.

At KS3, young people undertake a broad and flexible range of study through 'PBL' (Project based learning). Young people work through a variety of topical based questions, developing enquiry skills, independent and collaborative working skills and have flexibility to learn in the way they feel comfortable with and can pursue challenge where appropriate. Young people also access the ACE (Alternative Curriculum Enrichment) Programme and also have the opportunity to gain qualifications in various ASDAN short course awards and AQA unit awards. This is achieved while still meeting the needs of the National Curriculum in readiness for examination study at Key Stage 4.

At KS4, the curriculum is planned to suit the needs of young people offering a personalised curriculum with a focus on GCSE and Functional Skills qualifications in English, Maths, Citizenship and Biology, with options in Art and ICT, along with our ACE (Alternative Curriculum Enrichment) Programme.

The ACE programme aims to provide opportunities to support young people in KS3 and KS4 to develop effective and essential life skills, often referred to as 'soft' skills, for example, independence, communication, positivity, resilience, perseverance, motivation, collaboration and reflection while at the same time nurturing their self-esteem and confidence. Through ACE, we also aim to provide relevant guidance and coping strategies in order to promote positive mental and physical health and well-being, in preparation for those times when our young people could be facing challenges such as anxiety, disruption to their sleep patterns or low mood. This programme encompasses a wealth of non-core subjects and topics including enterprise, travel training, preparing for college and further education, with opportunities to study Animal Care or the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Hospital School Room:

We follow the National Curriculum and close liaison between the hospital School Room staff and home schools ensures that, wherever possible, work set for young people is in line with their stage of development and similar to that of their peers. This minimizes the disruption to education experienced by the children during a hospital stay. Each term a creative cross-

		curricular theme allows access to all areas of the timetable, enabling young people who are short stay or have no work from their usual school to enjoy a positive learning experience. Realistic targets and objectives to develop subject specific knowledge, skills and understanding are set taking into account health needs. The focus is on core subjects. Foundation topics are delivered too. SMSC and RSE are planned into the curriculum while art projects allow the young people to learn therapeutically. Building young people's selfesteem and self-confidence is key and staff are always mindful of this.

Rebuilding education for our learners

We aim to broaden our young people' horizons by offering new challenges through both our academic and creative curriculum.

Our core values are based around **S**upport, **T**rust, **A**chieve and **R**espect.

Our core curriculum includes English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Physical Education, and Learning4Life. In addition, an extensive range of behaviour interventions are offered to all young people including bespoke workshops and Accelerated Reading and Accelerated Mathematics.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme and our own Vespa Award (Volunteering, Expedition, Skills and Physical Award) supplement the core curriculum. We also offer all young people the opportunity to achieve ASDAN qualifications through a creative curriculum, which include STEM, Food Technology, Graffiti Art, Digital Technology (iDEA) and Creative Music.

		In addition, we also have three project-based learning days a term focussing on Modern Foreign Languages, Computing & Robotics, and Religious Education.
		Most of our full-time provision is taught in a classroom environment by highly qualified teachers and support staff.
		The Centre prides itself on its positive, nurturing ethos in which the educational and pastoral care of its children is of paramount importance. 
We aim to broaden our young people' horizons by offering new challenges through both our academic and creative curriculums.

Young people can gain qualifications from entry level through to GCSE and cover the core subjects of Mathematics, English, Science, Learning4Life and PE. Young people can also study a range of Technical/Vocational subjects including Art, Photography, Music Technology, Food Technology, Technology (Resistant Materials),

		Construction, Motor Vehicles, Hair & Beauty, Child Development and Sport. This enables a young person to have a personalised curriculum that meets their individual needs and interests.

The tuition service supports the most complex and challenging young people who are not in school. Young people are referred to the service by the LA via ISAPP with no implication that the young person would be expected to attend Lawnswood Campus. If progress is good and the service feels that the young person is ready to engage in one of the Centres on Lawnswood Campus and there was an LA space available, the young person would be presented at ISAPP for the service. The tuition service would be considered an interim arrangement and the proposed exit strategy would be fully supported. Learning and engagement is carefully monitored and reviewed weekly with the Executive Head Teacher with a formal review four weeks after commencement of service and every six weeks thereafter. Reviews will include all relevant stakeholders and consider next steps based on evidence gathered over the tuition period and include any external factors. In addition, parents are kept informed of timetables, behaviour, engagement and progress and regular direct contact with parents is seen as an important element of the service.
