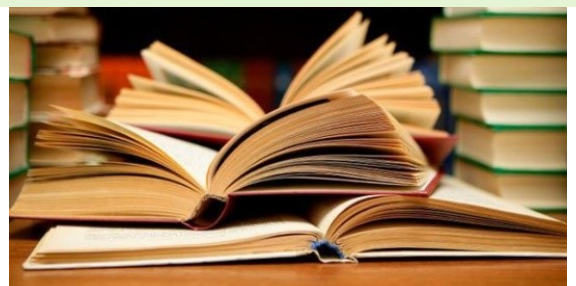

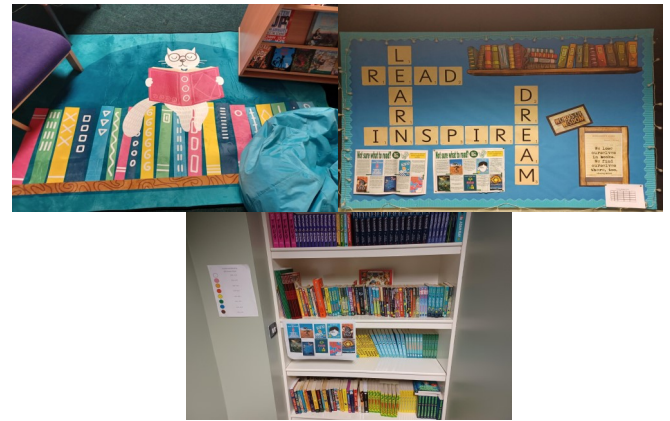
## Active Reading

Learners are given the opportunity to take part in 'Active Reading'. They are shown different games they can play whilst reading. Learners use a range of reading skills to guess missing words, from a range of texts. Through the use of pictures, learners can develop their ability to infer. Once this is established, they can transfer this skill to texts.



## Orchard Free Book Boxes

Placed around centre will be 'Free Book Boxes'. They will be filled with different texts that are free. If you want to rent the book and return it, great! If you want to keep it, even better! By giving out free books, there is always an opportunity for our learners to read!



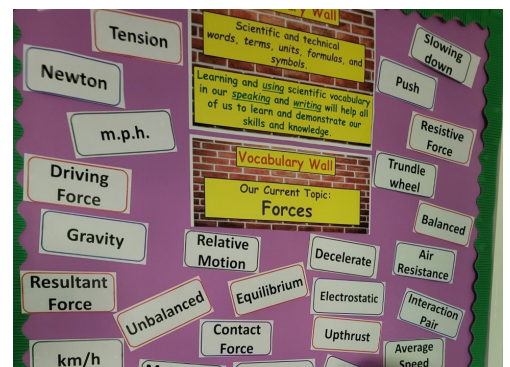
## Reading Environment

## Form Reading Challenges

Form groups will be asked to take part in **Weekly Reading Challenges**. Ranging from gathering and collecting fiction texts, to finding authors who've published stories this year. This will be adapted to match emerging topics, such as Black History, Easter, Current events etc.



## Vocabulary wall

Pre-teaching of key terms in subjects helps our learners to develop their vocabulary. **Vocabulary Grids** support this by, exposing readers to vocabulary in a variety of different contexts.



## Head Teacher's Postcards
