We work with young people who have been permanently excluded or are at risk of permanent exclusion. Our Ambition: To be the leading light for Alternative Provision. 		Our Vision: We believe that young people deserve to be given exceptional educational opportunities and a sense of belonging in safe, nurturing and supportive learning environments. Places of learning where relationships are

built, individual needs are met, ambition is fostered and knowledge and skills are provided so young people can achieve their potential and have brighter futures.

Our Values: Kindness, Empathy, Honesty, Positivity, Curiosity, Resilience, Commitment, Responsibility.

We support all our young people through a tailored curriculum and a range of early intervention strategies.

Midpoint works in partnership with the local authority, mainstream schools, academies and parents/carers as well as other organisations. We work together to support the academic and social development of all of our young people, preparing them for a successful future.

We have high expectations of our young people. This includes wearing school uniform, a commitment to improving behaviour and attendance and a desire to make accelerated progress in their learning.

Young people have access to a range of academic and vocational qualifications. We are supported by specialist teachers, mentors, teaching assistants and other agencies such as CAMHS and Wolverhampton Connexions.

We work in partnership with mainstream schools, academies and other organisations to ensure the needs of our young people are met. We ensure that strong links with mainstream schools are maintained and liaison takes place on a regular basis.

Our high expectations for all of our young people regarding their behaviour, progress and uniform along with a schoolbased environment puts us at the forefront of Key Stage 4 alternative provision in Wolverhampton.

Rebuilding education for our learners

We aim to broaden our young people' horizons by offering new challenges through both our academic and creative curriculums.

Our curriculum supports young people to make good progress and narrow the gaps in learning and is taught by enthusiastic qualified teachers.

Young people can gain qualifications from entry level through to GCSE and cover the core subjects of Mathematics, English, Science, Learning4Life and PE. Young people can also study a range of Technical/Vocational subjects including Art, Photography, Music Technology,

		Food Technology, Technology (Resistant Materials), Construction, Motor Vehicles, Hair & Beauty, Child Development and Sport. This enables a young person to have a personalised curriculum that meets their individual needs and interests.
		Young people are also able to gain specific qualifications to support their access to work, including Preparation for Working Life, Emergency First Aid, Health & Safety in the Workplace and Food Hygiene.
		All of our full-time provision is taught in a classroom environment and a purpose-built skills centre by highly qualified teachers and support staff.
		The centre prides itself on its positive, nurturing ethos in which the educational and pastoral care of its children is of paramount importance. The social, emotional and mental health of our young people is met with a comprehensive support package which includes Lawnswood Integrated Services which delivers professional counselling and support.
